Composting For Everyone by Alisa Tjelmel

Compost is the fluffy black dirt-like substance from the breakdown of organic matter by soil microbes. Composting is the earth-friendly process of creating this "black gold" by combining household food scraps, paper, & yard waste with a bit of soil, sunshine, & water. Easy & free for anyone, whether you live in an apartment with a patio or a house with a yard, you likely already have everything you need to get started!

A Balancing Act: For organic materials to break down in your compost pile & minimize odors, strive for a balance between green (moister) & brown (drier) materials, or roughly 40% green & 60% brown. Green materials include household food scraps from vegetables, fruits, & grains: peels, rotten produce, moldy bread, stale cereal, coffee grounds, tea leaves, & the like. Egg shells are a great addition to the pile but never use eggs, meats, or dairy products as this will likely attract wildlife, flies, & your own pet(s), plus it will cause your compost pile to emit foul odors. Grass clippings are part of the greens & can be added in huge quantities as they break down fast. Brown materials include paper scraps & newspaper torn into strips or pieces. Shredded junk mail & personal documents go right into our compost pile. Avoid using paper with glossy or laminate coatings such as magazine paper; toss those into the recycle bin instead. Leaves are browns. A heaping pile of leaves will shrink down to a small layer in a day or two. Sticks should NOT be used in your compost pile as they will take years to decompose & make the pile difficult to manage. Never put dog & cat feces into the compost pile since these wastes contain meat products & pathogens. However, do toss in the shavings & feces of herbivorous pets like rabbits, hamsters, guinea pigs, & gerbils. Even dryer lint is great for compost!

To make it easy, keep a gallon-sized plastic tub with a lid under the kitchen sink for food scraps, egg shells, etc. Using waste products from your house & yard will result in a natural balance of compost. You'll have less garbage to deal with & save some money on pricey garbage bags too.

To Stir or Not to Stir, That is the Question: Passive & Active are the two extremes of composting with everything in between. Whatever you choose for your own compost pile is just fine. Passive composting: put appropriate materials into the compost pile then leave it alone. The materials will break down into compost; it just takes considerably longer (a year instead of two months for example). But for reducing household garbage & yard waste, this works great. Even if you don't have a garden, you can still compost to reduce waste. Active composting involves frequent stirring. The more stirring, the faster the materials will breakdown into useable compost. Active composters want a quicker turnover because they are continually using the compost as a soil amender in their vegetable & flower gardens & when planting shrubs & trees. The addition of compost serves many functions from improving drainage in clay soils to fortifying poor sandy soils. Active composting may also include the addition of water in drier climates. Spray the pile with the garden hose weekly or let the sprinklers hit it. The texture of your compost should be crumbly, soft, & moist like cooked white rice. Adding too much water may result in a clumpy, gummy mess that is difficult to stir. Just add more dry materials & you're back in business.

A Place In the Sun: Where to put the compost pile? For apartment or condo dwellers with a patio or balcony, a big plastic or terra cotta planter works. An old trash barrel with holes drilled in the sides & bottom for air circulation & drainage will work just fine. The finished compost can be used in your indoor potted plants. For gifts for gardeners, scoop some compost into medium-sized plastic bags, tie with

What is CenCON? by Dale Rottschafer -

CenCON stands for the Centennial Council of Neighborhoods. It consists of nearly 60 Homeowners Associations and Civic Associations throughout all of Centennial representing about 22,000 households. CenCON meetings are the 4th Monday of each month at the Library Administration Building near the Centennial Airport. At these meetings, neighborhood members receive updates on happenings within and near our community from various civic authorities such as Arapahoe County Sheriff, Arapahoe County Library District, Arapahoe Park & Rec, South Suburban Parks and Rec, Littleton Fire and Rescue, South Metro Fire Authority, Centennial Open Space,

bows, & give to friends for their potted plants. The nutrient-rich compost will help healthy plants thrive & perk up scraggly ones. Compost is a gift that truly keeps on giving!

For those with gardens, place your compost pile in a sunny spot off the beaten path, preferably next to your garden for easy maintenance & use. If you have dogs, consider putting your compost pile (& garden) behind a wire fence. Anything that allows sunshine, air, & water to get in & excess moisture to drain will work. For those Active composters, be sure you have easy access for stirring. Till compost right into your garden soil prior to Spring planting. Till in more compost after Fall harvest.

Composting is the Future: Using your household waste for composting is a win-win-win! Composting results in thriving plant life for our beautiful gardens/yards, less garbage filling limited landfill space, is easy, & free!

City of Centennial, etc. CenCON also reviews development plans for projects both within and affecting the City of Centennial and gives requested critical input as an official referral agency of the Planning & Zoning Department. CenCON input regarding planned developments is also seriously considered by the Mayor and City Council. For example, it is due to a coalition of neighborhood members of CenCON that we have a Southglenn branch library. Another coalition of neighborhood members shared concerns of increased traffic on Dry Creek and County Line if C470 were made a toll road, resulting in the compromise that was reached on that matter. CenCON representatives have two major responsibilities:

- To voice the interests of your member association and to vote on debated issues.
- To return to your member association with the news and information learned at the meeting.

CenCON has struggled recently to have a quorum present at meetings and attendance even from our own neighborhood has been inconsistent. The information shared at these meetings and the feedback provided from CenCON to the city and county is so important and can have direct impact to us here in Southglenn. For this reason, we want to make sure Southglenn has a consistent presence at the CenCON meetings. We need help to make sure this vital flow of information to and from our civic authorities happens consistently and reliably. Would you like to attend CenCON meetings and be a liaison for the Southglenn Civic Association? Or share those duties with another? If so, please let me or another board member know of your interest. RECIPES FOR EMERGENCY SPOTTING

*** Always test fabric for color stability ***

For oil base spots (Ink, grease, oil paint, marker, etc.), use:

- Isopropyl rubbing alcohol, white towel.
- Pour alcohol on to white towel and dab. (Do not rub)
- Repeat process as necessary.

For Beverages, urine, blood, spaghetti sauce etc., use:

- · One inch distilled white vinegar
- One inch sudsy clear ammonia into 16 oz. spray bottle.
- Fill the spray bottle with cold water.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- · Blot spot with white dry towel to remove excess.
- Spray mixed solution on spot.
- Blot with white dry towel (Do not rub).
- Repeat process as needed.

Have you planted your vegetable garden yet? It isn't too late. The average last freeze date in the spring for the Denver Metro area is May 5th. This is the date it is safe to transplant tomatoes, peppers, cabbage, broccoli, etc., outdoors. Many people tend to use Mother's Day as their reminder. Most crops will mature by August if planted on schedule. Stretching the harvest into September is very realistic for those who get late starts.

When deciding where to put your garden and what to plant, remember that vegetables that you are growing for the root (potatoes, carrots, etc.) or the fruit (tomatoes, peppers) do best will full sun. All others can tolerate, and may even prefer, some shade throughout the day. Those overgrown trees on the other side of the fence may turn out to be an asset to your garden after all.

The soil in our area is primarily alkaline with a high pH This is typical for clay-like soil and low rainfall areas. With lengthy dry spells, the ground hardens, making it more difficult for the soil to absorb and hold moisture when precipitation does happen. Soil with high pH creates problems for food crops as nutrients cannot be effectively absorbed. Light green/yelllow leaves are symptoms of iron deficiencies, which is a very common problem in alkaline soil.

Lowering pH is not difficult, but it does take some time and patience. The best way to lower soil pH is to add amendments to the soil such as compost and manure, peat moss or leaf mold. When first planting a garden, an effective way to improve drainage and improve the soil is to double dig. Start by digging a trench a shovel blade deep, reserving the soil from the trench on a tarp. Use a pitch fork to poke into the bottom of the trench, stand on the shoulders of the tines to sink it deep into the soil and pry or twist the pitchfork to loosen the dirt as deep as possible. Add in a thick layer (3-4 inches) of soil amendment (compost or manure). Begin digging another trench right next to, and parallel to, the first trench, and repeat the steps with the pitchfork and adding amendments. When your garden bed reaches your desired length, use the reserved dirt on the tarp to fill in the final trench. In future years, you can simply add compost or manure to the top of your garden beds in the fall, and turn it into the ground as you plant the following spring. Or you can rototill it into the soil, being careful to limit how much walking you do on your prepared garden bed. You do not compact the soil you've worked so hard to loosen. The loosening of soil to improve drainage and the organic amendments to the soil will go a long way to help reduce the pH level of your soil to provide for greater gardening success.




