Please consider participating in the Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) program from Grant Farms. By purchasing a share of the farm's harvest at the beginning of the season, the farmer can better plan their crops and avoid borrowing money to pay for seeds and workers to plant them. And the risks of weather related crop damage are borne by all the participants, not just the farmer. That's the "community" in CSA. Crop insurance is not practical and is very expensive for a multi-crop farm.

For 2014, I have volunteered to host a pick-up site and am located on Easter Court here in Southglenn. But this will only happen if there is sufficient participation to justify it. The CSA shares consist of a variety of veggies (and some fruit) grown on an organic farm outside of Fort Collins. Shares consist of what is ready to be harvested at that time. Various share sizes are available. The farm will deliver to my house weekly where participants pick up their shares.

In addition to their own produce, the CSA program offers eggs, fruit, cheese, and mushrooms (to name a few) from other locally sourced vendors. Please check out <http://www.grantfarms.com/> to see what the 2014 season has in store.

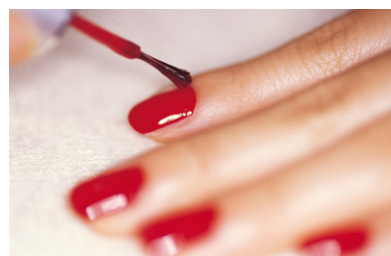

Littleton Public Schools Seniors Maria Brock and Joe Redmond of Arapahoe High School, and Marc Thomson of Heritage High School, have been named 2014 Boettcher Scholarship Finalists. Only 40 Colorado seniors are selected each year. Congratulations!

### Three LPS Seniors Named U.S. Presidential Scholar Candidates

Three Littleton Public Schools seniors have recently been named U.S. Presidential Scholar Candidates. They are: Joe Redmond, Arapahoe High School, Erik Gentile, Heritage High School, Marc Thomson, Heritage High School.

Participation in the national Presidential Scholar Program is by invitation only and is based on exceptional scores on the SAT or the ACT as well as outstanding academic achievement. Only 65 high school seniors in Colorado were named Presidential Scholar Candidates for the 2013-2014 school year. Semifinalists will be named in late March from this pool of Candidates; the Commission on Presidential Scholars will make its final selections of Presidential Scholars in April.

The U.S. Presidential Scholars Program was established in 1964, by executive order of the President, to recognize and honor some of our nation's most distinguished graduating high school seniors. In 1979, the program was extended to recognize students who demonstrate exceptional talent in the visual, creative and performing arts. Each year, only as many as 121 students across the nation are named as Presidential Scholars, one of the nation's highest honors for high school students. An additional 20 students will be named Presidential Scholars in the Arts.

### 2014 National Merit Scholarship Program

Thirteen Littleton Public Schools seniors have recently been named National Merit Finalists in the National Merit Scholarship Program. To be named a finalist, students must not only have an outstanding academic record, they also must be endorsed and recommended by their principal. Candidates submit their SAT scores, a detailed scholarship application including an essay, and submit information about their participation and leadership in school and community activities. National Merit Finalists nationwide will be awarded more than \$36 million in scholarships.

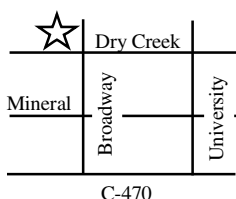

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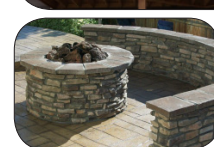
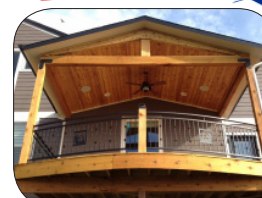
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
