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Thefts from Vehicles

Arapahoe County Sheriff

The Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office wants to work with you to prevent criminal activity. Thefts from motor vehicles are crimes in which thieves take valuables from parked cars, usually without stealing the cars. These can frequently be prevented. Here are some tips that may prevent you from becoming a victim:

- Always completely roll up your windows and lock your vehicle doors when parked. Don't be an easy target. Breaking into vehicles quietly takes longer, and smashing a window makes noise, both of which may attract attention.
- Remove valuables when parking for long periods. Parking overnight at home or in parking lots for long periods, such as at the airport, at sporting events, when out for dinner and a movie, are when thieves have the longest opportunity to strike.
- Hide valuables when parking for short periods. When parking while running errands, packages and bags with store logos can be inviting targets. Secure them in the trunk or cover them.
- Put vehicle accessories like handicapped parking placards, GPS units, satellite radios, and radar detectors in the glove

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Sertoma Walk

The Denver Area Sertoma Clubs recently sponsored an event called "Celebrate Sound, Don't walk in Silence." The walk began and ended at the Southglenn Country Club and featured Miss Colorado of 2012, Hannah Porter.

With 130 registered participants, the 2.6 mile walk raised \$11,740. Half of the net proceeds will be used to support a community hearing health project sponsored by the greater Denver area Sertoma Clubs. The other half of the proceeds will help fund Sertoma's national hearing health mission projects such as:

- College scholarships for hard-of-hearing and deaf students
- Scholarships for those pursuing graduate studies in speech-language pathology or audiology
- SAFEEars! – an awareness program for the prevention of Noise Induced Hearing Loss
- A Sound Investment campaign to promote better public accessibility for people using assistive hearing devices
- Grants to local non-profits providing hearing healthcare in communities across the nation.

box or console when you park the vehicle for long periods. These items are frequent targets for thieves.

- Whenever possible, park your vehicle (s) in a closed and locked garage.
- If garage parking is not possible, park in your driveway or in a well lit lot or area. Consider motion lights aimed at your driveway to deter thieves and provide extra safety as you enter and exit your vehicles at night. Well lit areas on a street or in a lot are better than darkened areas.
- Report all suspicious persons and activities to the Sheriff's Office immediately. People trying door handles, looking into parked cars, etc. should be reported.

Auto Maintenance Corner

As temperatures climb and traffic snarls, the last thing we often think about is the health of our vehicles. An oasis of air conditioning amidst a parking lot of gridlock, our vehicles provide us safety and comfort but can be just as susceptible to the heat as we are.

Remember to routinely check and change the fluids in your vehicles. Higher temperatures strain engines, especially when they're forced to climb mountain passes and roads, making lubrication essential to auto health. At high temperatures oil begins to breakdown and starts losing its lubricating capabilities, causing engines to bog and even lock up. Just as important as keeping your oil topped off and fresh is making sure that your engine's coolant is up to snuff. If it's been a while since the last time the coolant in your vehicle was



replaced, try taking it to a garage to get the coolant flushed, or do it yourself. If taking this on yourself, be sure to consult your maintenance manuals and be sure to free as much air as possible from the system. Believe it or not the same coolant that keeps your engine from overheating can keep your air conditioning blowing cool.

Does your car spend a majority of the day outside? If so, regular washes will help to keep windows clear and the outside world visible. Regular washes also provide the added benefit of being able to spot any scratches, dings, or damage to your car's exterior. If it's been a while since your last wash, consider selecting a car wash with undercarriage cleaning. Caustic road chemicals used for deicing can wreak havoc on exposed metal.

Remember to regularly check tire pressures and inspect the treads for excessive wear. Use the penny test to gauge tire life.

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Auto Maintenance Corner

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If Lincoln's head is still visible on a penny inserted into the tread upside down, it's time for new tires. With the heating and cooling of the day, air in tires can expand and contract, leaving an overinflated tire prone to excess stress in the heat and an underinflated tire to irregular wear during the morning commute.

One additional note on saving a little more at the gas pump, try to time your fill ups for the morning drive. Gas stations keep their gas in underground tanks, which cool in the evenings. As the gas cools, it becomes ever so slightly more dense, allowing you to get slightly more gas for your dollar if you fill up in the mornings.

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I Found A Baby Bird! What Do I Do?

This time of year can bring the joy of discovering a bird nest near your home, or the heartbreak of finding one of the baby birds on the ground. If the baby is uninjured, with pink skin or pin-feathers only, try to warm it by setting it on a closed container of warm water (keep the bird dry!), then place it back into the nest. Contrary to urban myth, birds will still care for their young after humans have touched them. If you find the same baby again, it is likely the parents have rejected it for other reasons and it is best to let nature take its course. If the nest has been blown down, you can put a substitute like a berry basket lined with soft material in its place and the parents may continue to care for it.



If the bird you found is almost fully feathered and hopping around, it's a fledgling. That means it's left the nest, but may not be ready to fly. This is an important part of the bird's natural development and they can survive without intervention. It is likely the parents are still nearby and will feed the baby when no one is around. Keep

dogs, cats, and kids away from the area for a few days, and that baby should fly off!

If you find a bird (or other animal) with an obvious injury, or a fledgling abandoned for a full day, you might choose to intervene. Keep yourself and your family safe by using precautions against disease transfer or injuries by wearing gloves, using carriers with secure closures, and washing all clothing,

hands, and implements used. Do not try to feed or force water on a captive animal. Baby birds can be injured by tweezers or forceps used because of the way they feed. It is best to not try to raise them yourself, no matter how much your kids beg you! It requires special training, a permit from the state, and feeding almost every hour around the clock! Take the animal to a licensed rehabilitator like wildbirdrehab.com. If you do, consider offering help with transportation or expenses as these places are usually non-profits with limited funding. As much as we love wildlife, South Platte Park is not licensed or equipped for them, but we're happy to try to help find someone who can. 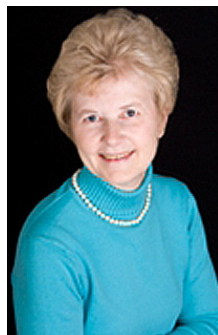
