
SOUTHGLENN COUNTRY CLUB

2020 Arapahoe County Fair Canceled Due to COVID-19 Impacts

Plans For a Limited 4-H Event Are Still Being Developed

After weighing all economic and public health and safety considerations, the Arapahoe County Board of Commissioners has decided to cancel the 2020 Arapahoe County Fair that had been scheduled for late-July. The County is finalizing details of hosting a limited 4-H competition and conducting a virtual junior livestock auction. The Arapahoe County Fair is one of many events across Colorado that have been canceled, postponed or moved to virtual settings in response to the COVID-19 public health crisis.

Last year's Arapahoe County Fair hosted a record number of visitors—more than 27,000 attendees across the four-day event. In making its decision, the Board consulted with the County's Fair management team—as well as with the Tri-County Health Department, the County's Office of Emergency Management, and event experts. It's unclear that COVID-19 concerns and public health orders will have abated enough by late-summer to make it safe to hold such a large public gathering at the Arapahoe County Fairgrounds & Events Center.

Results for the 2020 South Suburban Board of Directors Election Incumbent James (Jim) Taylor and Ken Lucas have each been elected to serve one three-year term on the South Suburban Board of Directors. They were sworn in at the May 13 meeting and will join current board members Pete Barrett, Dave Lawful, and Susan Pye. Taylor will be serving his second consecutive term, while Scott Labrash was term-limited and retired from the board.

SPLASH DASH 5K RESCHEDULED

Drennen's Dreams Foundation

After reviewing the current guidelines we decided to reschedule the 2020 SplashDash 5K for August 2. This is the tenth year since Drennen's tragic drowning incident. Drennen O'Melia drowned in a guarded pool in 2010. The SplashDash supports our mission to honor Drennen's legacy by teaching and training lifeguards and aquatics professionals so that no one drowns at a guarded facility. Drowning is preventable with all of us working together.

We hope you stay healthy, have hope and are able to join us in August.

HOMEWORK HELP FOR STUDENTS IN 4TH-12TH GRADES

The Arapahoe Library District offers free, online tutorial help called "Homework Help." Students may log on for a live 20-minute session at selected libraries or log on remotely from home. "Homework Help" can be found on the library district's website at www.arapahoelibraries.org. Assistance is available in math, language arts, science and social studies. "Homework Help" is available 35 hours per week: Sunday-Thursday, from 4-10 p.m., and Saturday, from noon-5 p.m. Students can connect from home, school, Koelbel main library, or at Smoky Hill, Glendale, or Sheridan branches. "Homework Help" is available at all public internet terminals in designated libraries. Most sessions run for 20 minutes, although the tutor will stay online with the student if the tutor determines that more assistance is needed, or if the student requests more help. The tutors are teachers, college professors, and graduate students, connected with the Princeton Review and they are specially trained in using online classrooms by Tutor. com. They must pass a 7-year criminal background check to provide the extra level of security for the Arapahoe Library District's young patrons.

ARAPAHOE COUNTY HAS REOPENED COUNTY FACILITIES TO THE PUBLIC

Visits will be by appointment only, with new health and safety protocols in place Arapahoe County will begin reopening its facilities to the public after being closed since late-March due to the coronavirus health crisis. Reopened buildings will operate under significant health and safety restrictions that are designed to protect the public and County employees by slowing the spread of COVID-19. These measures – which require customers to wear masks and practice social distancing – will remain in place indefinitely, and the County will continually reevaluate its practices as new public health information, data and guidelines become available.

Most County services are available online, and residents should continue to follow safer at home guidelines and limit travel to help slow the spread of the virus. This includes any visits to County facilities, and residents should schedule appointments whenever possible rather than simply coming to a facility.
