

Have a Healthy and Wonderful Easter and be a good neighbor. That is what makes our neighborhood special!


## INPUT NEEDED FOR ARAPAHOE/YOSEMITE STUDY

## CASH RELIEF ACTIVATED FOR ARAPAHOE COUNTY FAMILIES IN NEED

Arapahoe County families experiencing economic hardship during the COVID-19 pandemic may qualify for short-term, state-sponsored financial assistance to help them through the crisis. Beginning immediately, families may apply for the Colorado Works County Emergency Disaster Program through Colorado PEAK, an online service that allows qualified Coloradans to screen and apply for medical, food, cash and early childhood assistance.

### Eligibility

- Family's annual gross income must be below \$75,000 combined
- The household must contain at least one child age 18 or younger
- Family must present a significant need for services directly related to the COVID-19 emergency
- Family must be legally present in the U.S.
- Assistance may include, but is not limited to, the following types:
  - Purchase or lease of shelter
  - Transportation (including car repairs and purchase)

- Non-covered medical expenses
- Work-related supplies that were lost or damaged
- Counseling services
- Non-medical mental health services

Eligible families may receive funds the same day they apply. Benefits are issued directly to an EBT card or to a bank account.

### How to apply

Visit Colorado PEAK, [www.Colorado.gov/PEAK](http://www.Colorado.gov/PEAK), and click on "apply for benefits" to access the online portal. Follow the prompts to create an account using a valid email, or apply as a guest if email isn't available. Once an account is created, Colorado PEAK will ask which benefit programs you are applying to; based on the information provided, families may qualify for additional public assistance.



Arapahoe County residents may email [ColoradoWorksDisasterProgram@arapahoe.gov](mailto:ColoradoWorksDisasterProgram@arapahoe.gov) for additional inquiries during this time as the County continues to provide support while County facilities are closed to the public.

# ARAPAHOE COUNTY TREASURER'S OFFICE TEMPORARY WAIVER OF DELINQUENT INTEREST

On March 20, 2020, Governor Polis signed an Executive Order granting County Treasurers the authority to waive delinquent interest on late tax payments. This Executive Order will remain in effect for 30 days, until April 20, 2020. Based on this Executive Order, Arapahoe County Treasurer Sue Sandstrom will waive interest as follows:

For those taxpayers who **did not make a first half tax payment by the March 2 due date**, and those who would now have difficulty making a full payment by the April 30 due date, you may now make the **first half payment of your tax liability by April 20, 2020**, and interest will be waived. Your **second half payment will then be due by June 15**.

For those taxpayers who have **already made a first half payment**, your **second half payment is due by June 15**.

If second half payments not made by June 15, such payments will still be subject to delinquent interest, unless the Governor extends the Executive Order or the State Legislature provides statutory relief.

Full payments remain due by April 30, and payments made after April 30 will still be subject to delinquent interest, unless the Governor extends the Executive Order, or the State Legislature provides statutory relief. Payments remitted by mortgage companies and title agencies are not included in this waiver of first half payment interest. Interest on delinquent payments from prior years and redemption interest on tax liens are also excluded from this waiver.

**IMPORTANT:** Please note that due to automation features, our online and over-the-phone payment system cannot waive interest. To take advantage of the waiver of interest on first half payments, you must mail your payment to our office or utilize the ballot box outside of the Administration Building as a drop box. Please see below for our mailing address and for drop-box location.

Please use the ballot box located outside the Arapahoe County Administration Building as a drop-box during the County closure. Please **DO NOT leave cash in the ballot box**. This is the only drop-box location available during the county closure.

You can complete the census questionnaire online or over the phone. (Census workers will still make in-person visits later this summer to count people who haven't yet responded to the survey.) So by taking 10 minutes to finish the questionnaire, you'll be making a difference, to yourself and your neighbors, for the next 10 years. As we continue practicing physical distancing, what else have you got to do? The Census Bureau began mailing invitations to households last week, so watch your mailbox for yours.

## LEARN HOW TO APPLY FOR AN SBA DISASTER LOAN

All Colorado counties are now eligible to apply for an SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loan by visiting [DisasterLoan.SBA.gov](https://DisasterLoan.SBA.gov). Now that funding has been approved by the SBA for Colorado, the Aurora-South Metro SBDC will begin webinars on “How to Apply for the SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loan program. Check out [Aurora-SouthMetroSBDC.com](https://Aurora-SouthMetroSBDC.com) for eligibility, criteria, and to register or join SBDC for a weekly “Virtual Coffee with the SBDC Director” to answer your business questions. This will begin Friday, March 27.

### Alternatives to laying off your employees

The Work-Share Program provides an alternative to laying off employees by allowing them to keep working, but with fewer hours. While an employee is working fewer hours, he or she may be eligible to collect part of his or her regular unemployment benefits. ## SOUTH SUBURBAN TO HOLD REGULAR DISTRICT ELECTION

South Suburban Park and Recreation District Board of Directors has called for a regular district election to fill two board director positions for three-year terms each. The next regular election of the South Suburban Park and Recreation District is on Tuesday, May 5, 2020. It will be a polling place election, with the option of obtaining an absentee ballot.

Due to the state of Colorado's Public Health Order 20-22 mandating the closure of South Suburban Park and Recreation District's (SSPRD) facilities, and to prevent the spread of COVID-19, the number of polling places for the May 5, 2020, election has changed to only one. In the continued effort to promote social distancing, SSPRD recommends voters apply for an absentee ballot before the April 28, 2020 deadline.

Voters can drop ballots at the absentee ballot box drop location the SSPRD Administration Offices, 6631 South University Boulevard, Centennial, Colo., 80121. Voters can also mail ballots to the SSPRD Administration Offices (additional postage is required). Drop box locations may be added when facilities reopen.


